Court Will Order Lewis Drop 'Illegal' Demands; Truman Move Is Awaited

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11 (AP) — Federal Judge Richard B. Kohn today ordered John L. Lewis to drop his "illegal" contract demands on the coal operators, or risk suit for contempt. 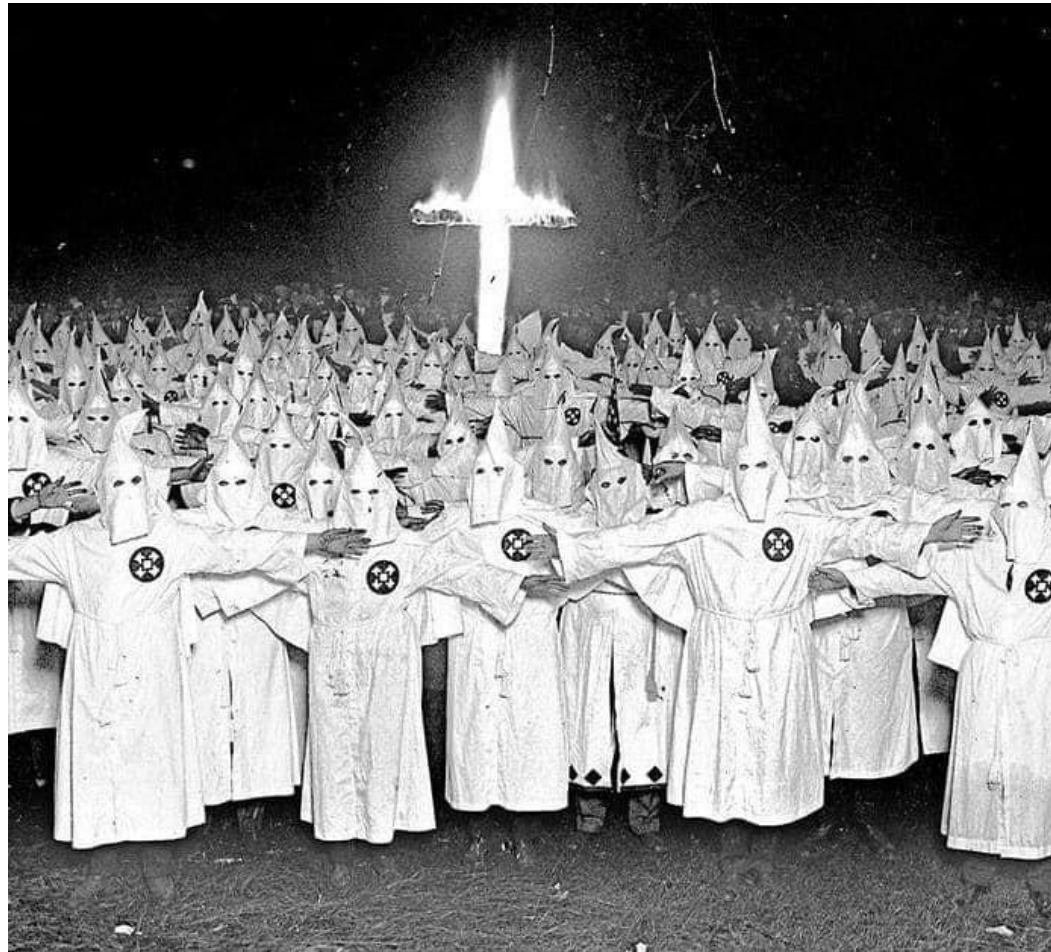
